July 8, 2019 Medford Historical Commission Hearing Minutes

Medford City Hall - Meeting called to order at 7:09pm.

<u>Members present:</u> Ryan Hayward, Doug Carr, Jennifer Keenan, Abigail Salerno, and Peter Miller, Ben Johnson. Absent: Edward Wiest.

109 Forest Street – Determination of Significance. Jen K. explained process. **Motion** to find 109 Forest Street **Significant**. Peter noted building's architectural qualities; consensus that the building is significant in both the individual building and its impact on the neighborhood. An early and well-preserved representative examples of Colonial architecture, setting the table for the future development of the Lawrence Estates.

Proponents: David Johnson, Steve Singer (attorney from Wakefield), Scott Kenworthy. Detailed description of process from developers' perspective.

Public comments (limited to Form B only, not the proposed development): general support for Significance by attendees (approx. 40 persons).

Approved, 5-0. Motion passes. Next month, 6 August 2019, a public meeting to see if 109 Forest Street will be Preferably Preserved.

John McConnell – Joseph Morris Wells @ Oak Grove Grave/potential CPA submission. Wells was a senior architect for McKim Meade & White; headstone design by Augustus Saint-Gaudens. **Motion** for Letter of Support from MHC. **Approved**, 6-0.

<u>Update on CPA Projects</u> – Oak Grove Cemetery & Thomas Brooks Park.

<u>Prescott Street</u> – garage was illegally demolished. MHC letter sent to Building Dept. Response letter from Paul Mochi, rejecting the MHC letter. Building Dept. did not follow procedures notifying the MHC of a demolition greater than 25% of the building. MHC to reject Mochi's letter and call out the Building Dept.'s not following procedures and refusing to incorporate MHC's standards into their Demo Forms, which remain inaccurate.

<u>16 Foster Court</u> – <u>Motion</u> to approach Medford Historic District Commission to create a single-use District covering 16 Foster Court. **Approved, 5-0**. Possibility of creating 3-single house districts for: 109 Forest Street, 21 Touro, 16 Foster Court.

2019 – 2020 Budget –\$20.8k Staff Person part-time request was rejected. FY 2020 \$30,000 total was approved.

Fall Community Events – Discussion of events and materials.

<u>Minutes</u> – June 2019 minutes reviewed. <u>Motion</u> to accept Minutes with minor corrections, <u>Approved</u>, 6-0.

Annual Report – completed and will be forwarded to Mayor.

<u>Survey Project Discussion</u> – Winter Hill neighborhood & Brickyards (South Medford) and Fulton Heights.

Stoneham – 120' Monopole proposed near intersection of Route 93 and 28 in the Middlesex Fells; D. Carr to write letter objecting.

Motion to adjourn at 9:15pm. Approved, 5-0. Notes by D. Carr.
